General Scope of Construction Project:

In October of 2011, Diné was awarded the contract to design and build a preengineered metal building to be used for storage of ATV's utilized by the Santa Teresa Border Patrol Station in Santa Teresa, NM. Using concept drawings developed by the Ft. Worth Corps of Engineers, Diné worked with local engineers to develop site and concrete drawings for the project. Engineers from Butler Manufacturing Co., Inc. provided engineer stamped drawings for the 40' x 100' pre-engineered metal building.

In addition to the pre-engineered building and slab, the project included site grading and drainage, exterior concrete paving, overhead doors, interior partitions, electrical and plumbing systems. Several existing structures were demolished and removed to make room for the new building.

Work began on site during the last week of December, 2011, and was completed in mid-February of 2012.
